Bachelor of Arts in Child Development and Family Studies

The B.A. in Child Development and Family Studies allows students to complete their Bachelor's degree specialized in either Child Development and Family Studies or Family Life Education. As an integrative and interdisciplinary specialization, it provides a comprehensive academic and professional preparation to serve in different roles that influence and enhance the quality of life of children and families. Admission Requirements

Admission for Freshman Admission to Child Development and Family Studies following which is consistent to the minimum

1. Complete each of the courses and college preparatory courses with the results of the redesigned SAT, old SAT or ACT.

- a. Graduates of California high schools and other California residents: 3,200 minimum "Eligibility Index" to be considered.
- b. Other non-California residents: 3,570 minimum "Eligibility Index" to be considered.
